2. HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

EMERGENCY OVERVIEW

DANGER. CORROSIVE. CAUSES SKIN AND EYE BURNS. HARMFUL OR FATAL IF SWALLOWED.

4. FIRST AID MEASURES
