Section 3 – Hazards Identification

Potential Health Effects

Eye: Contact may cause transient eye irritation. Inflammation of the eye is characterized by redness, watering, and itching.

Skin: Contact may cause slight skin irritation.

Ingestion: May cause irritation of the digestive tract.

Inhalation: May be irritating to mucous membranes and upper respiratory tract.

Section 4 – First Aid Measures

Eyes: Immediately flush eyes with copious amounts of water, occasionally lifting the upper and lower eyelids. Get medical attention if irritation occurs.

Skin: Gently and thoroughly wash the contaminated skin with running water and non-abrasive soap. Be particularly careful to clean folds, crevices, creases and groin. Cover the irritated skin with an emollient. If irritation persists, seek medical attention.

Ingestion: Do not induce vomiting. Wash out mouth with water. Get medical aid.

Inhalation: Remove to fresh air. If symptoms develop seek immediate medical attention.

Section 5 – Fire Fighting Measures

General Information: As in any fire, wear a self-contained breathing apparatus in pressure-demand, MSHA/NIOSH (approved or equivalent), and full protective gear. During a fire, irritating and toxic gases may be generated by thermal decomposition or combustion.
