Signs and System torus of Exposure: Direct eye contact with concentrate can cause severe eye irritation; and direct skin contact will reduce severe irritation, which upon prolonged contact may produce burns. Medical Conditions Generally Aggravated by Exposure: None known to manufacturer.

Emergency and First Aid Procedures: Eyes: Flush with large amounts of running water for at least 15 minutes. Hold eyelids apart to ensure rinsing of the entire surface of the eye and lids with water. Get immediate medical attention. If physician is not available, flush for additional 15 minutes and then transport victim to medical care. Skin: Wash with large amounts of running water, and soap if available, for 15 minutes; Remove contaminated clothing and shoes. Get immediate medical attention. Steps To Be Taken in Case Material Is Released Or Spilled: Caution. Floors may become slippery. Wear appropriate protective gear and respiratory protection where mist or vapors of unknown concentrations may be generated (self-contained breathing apparatus proferred). Lose and contain spill with inert material (sand, earth, etc.) and transfer the liquid and solid separately to containers of recovery or disposal. Keep spill out of sewers and open bodies of water.
