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<b>Potential Health Effects (Acute and Chronic):</b>	Prolonged or repeated eye contact may cause conjunctivitis.  Prolonged or repeated skin contact may cause dermatitis.
<b>Inhalation:</b>	Harmful if inhaled. Irritation may lead to chemical pneumonitis and pulmonary edema. Causes severe irritation of upper respiratory tract with coughing, burns, breathing difficulty, and possible coma.
<b>Skin Contact:</b>	Causes severe burns with delayed tissue destruction. Causes redness and pain. May cause skin rash (in milder cases), and cold and clammy skin with cyanosis or pale color. Causes skin irritation. Harmful if absorbed through the skin.

### 4. First Aid Measures

#### Emergency and First Aid

##### Procedures:

<b>In Case of Inhalation:</b>	Remove from exposure and move to fresh air immediately. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. Do NOT use mouth-to-mouth resuscitation. If breathing has ceased apply artificial respiration using oxygen and a suitable mechanical device such as a bag and a mask. Get medical aid.
<b>In Case of Skin Contact:</b>	Flush skin with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes while removing contaminated clothing and shoes. Wash clothing before reuse. Discard contaminated clothing in a manner which limits further exposure. Destroy contaminated shoes. Get medical aid if irritation develops or persists.
<b>In Case of Eye Contact:</b>	Flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes, occasionally lifting the upper and lower eyelids. Get medical aid immediately. Do NOT allow victim to rub eyes or keep eyes closed. Extensive irrigation with water is required (at least 30 minutes).
<b>In Case of Ingestion:</b>	If victim is conscious and alert, give 2-4 cupfuls of milk or water. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Get medical aid immediately. Call a poison control center.
<b>Note to Physician:</b>	Treat symptomatically and supportively.


