**Signal Word.** Danger

**Hazard Statement.** Corrosive to the eyes, skin, gastrointestinal tract and respiratory system.

**Precautionary Statements.** Wear protective gloves, splash goggles, face shield and protective clothing. Wash thoroughly after handling.

### Acute Effects

**Eyes.** Causes burns and may result in permanent injury to eyes including blindness.

**Skin.** Causes corrosive burns. Brief exposures may cause irritation and defatting of the skin. Exposures not promptly washed off may lead to toxic effects similar to ingestion. Harmful if absorbed through the skin.

**Inhalation.** Mists and vapors can irritate the throat and respiratory tract. High vapor concentrations may cause central nervous system effects. Symptoms may include headaches, dizziness, and drowsiness.

**Ingestion.** Although relatively low in toxicity, ingestion can cause gastrointestinal irritation, swelling of the larynx, difficulty in breathing, circulatory shock, convulsions and possibly death.

## 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

## 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

**Spill Clean Up.** Put on appropriate personal protective equipment (see section 8). Stop leak if without risk. Move Containers from spill area. ## 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

Keep in the original container or an approved alternative made from a compatible material, kept tightly closed when not in use. Do not reuse container. Wash thoroughly after handling.

**Storage.** Store between the following temperatures: 4.44 to 48.9°C (40 to 120°F). Store in accordance with local regulations. Store in original container protected from direct sunlight in a dry, cool and well-ventilated area, away from incompatible materials (see section 10) and food and drink. Separate from acids. Keep container tightly closed and sealed until ready for use. Containers that have been opened must be carefully resealed and kept upright to prevent leakage. Do not store in unlabeled containers. Use appropriate containment to avoid environmental contamination.
